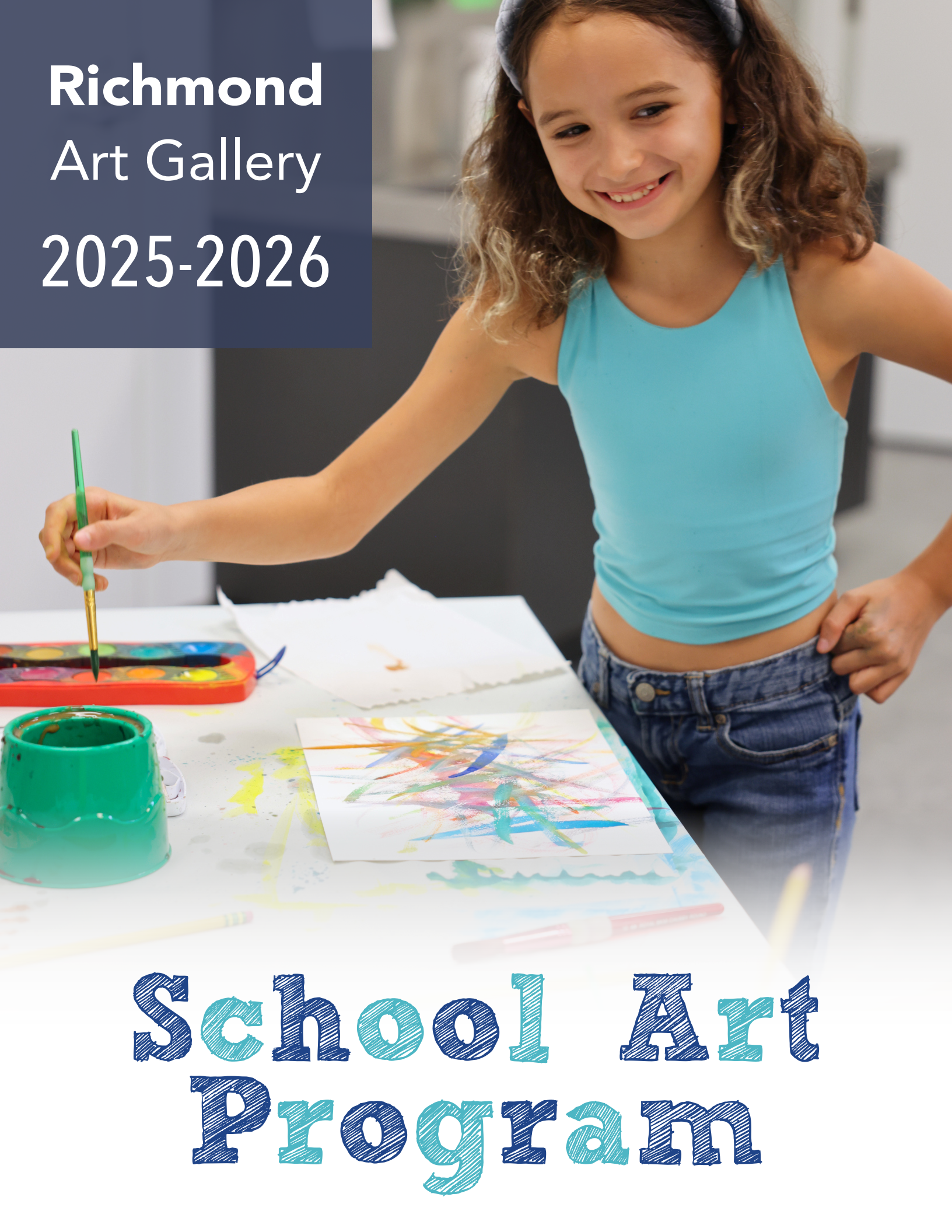

Manuel Axel Strain: *xʷə́hiwən ce:p kʷθəθ nə́weyəl* (((Remember your teachings)))

Artist Manuel Axel Strain embraces and exalts the traditional Coast Salish cedar longhouse as a way of confronting the colonial context surrounding them. This major multi-media exhibition—including paintings, sculptures, family photographs, video, and installation—promises to transform the Gallery with a dynamic mix of new and recent artworks rendered in Strain's boldly unique style.

Group Exhibition: *I digress*

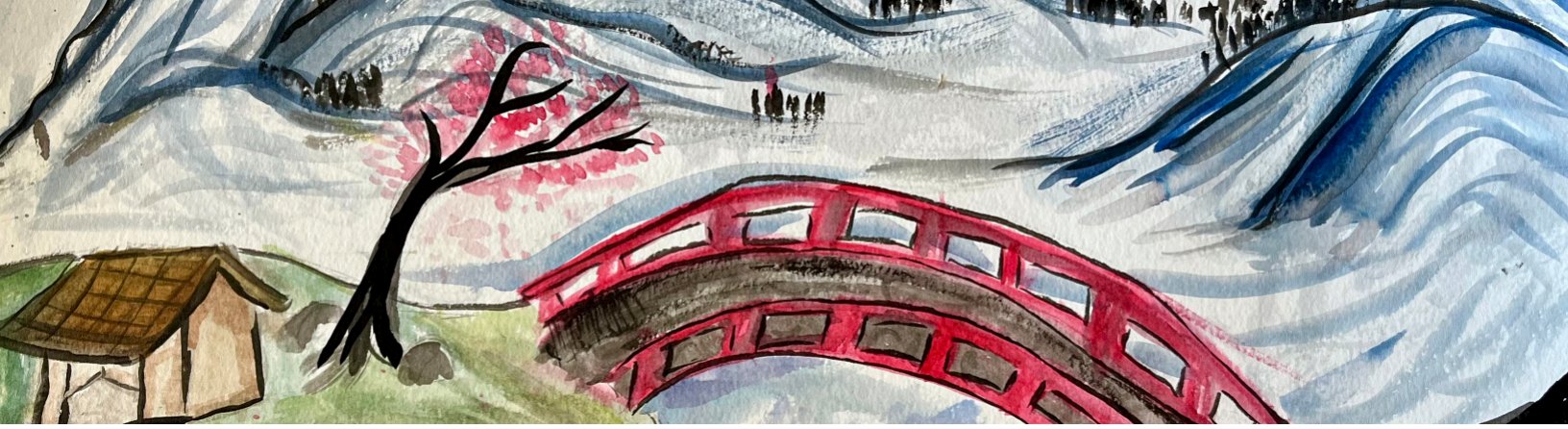
Side Core: *Concrete Planet*

Featuring photography, video, and print media, *I digress* focusses on artists who work in an autobiographical, diaristic, or confessional vein, drawing inspiration from memoirs, journals, letters, family albums, and archives. *Concrete Planet* aspires to discover how people and urban environments interact. Side Core filmed sites normally inaccessible to the general public, such as an abandoned subway station, all from the POV of a skateboard.

Art Workshop: *Visual Storytelling*

Examining how images and text can communicate emotion and meaning, students will create an artwork exploring a personal narrative.



Classroom Art Kits

Can't visit the gallery? Have the gallery come to you! These kits were designed with simplicity in mind to make incorporating art content into your classroom as easy as possible. Available for three-week rentals, these kits bring hands-on learning from professional artists to the classroom.

Each kit includes:

- Videos of Canadian artists discussing their artwork
- Step-by-step video instruction by art instructors
- High-quality art supplies and tools
- Lesson plans, discussion topics, and project resources

Cost:

\$120 a for 3-week rental for one class (max 30 students)

\$60 to add supplies for each additional class of up to 30 students

Classroom Art Kit Descriptions



Indigenous Art: Embroidery, Beading and Tufting Grades K-7

In this kit, artist Michelle Sound introduces the techniques of embroidery, beading, and caribou tufting, and students will create their own artwork incorporating these three techniques using burlap, beads and yarn. Supplies include pre-cut pieces of burlap, a selection of yarn colours, multi-coloured beads, and beading needles.



Indigenous Art: Drum Designs Grades 4-7

In this kit, artist Michelle Sound demonstrates how to make a drum from deer hide, and how in her own art practice she uses the drum form as a canvas for painting. Students will then paint their own drum designs with acrylic paint on canvas. Supplies include pre-cut pieces of primed canvas, acrylic paints, and paint brushes.



Chinese Art: Then and Now Grades 3-7

In this kit, students will learn the history of Chinese Calligraphy and painting, and how contemporary Canadian artists are drawing on their Chinese heritage in the creation of new artworks. Students will then learn the basic brushstroke techniques and be guided through painting a landscape. Supplies include ink, watercolour paper, and paint brushes.

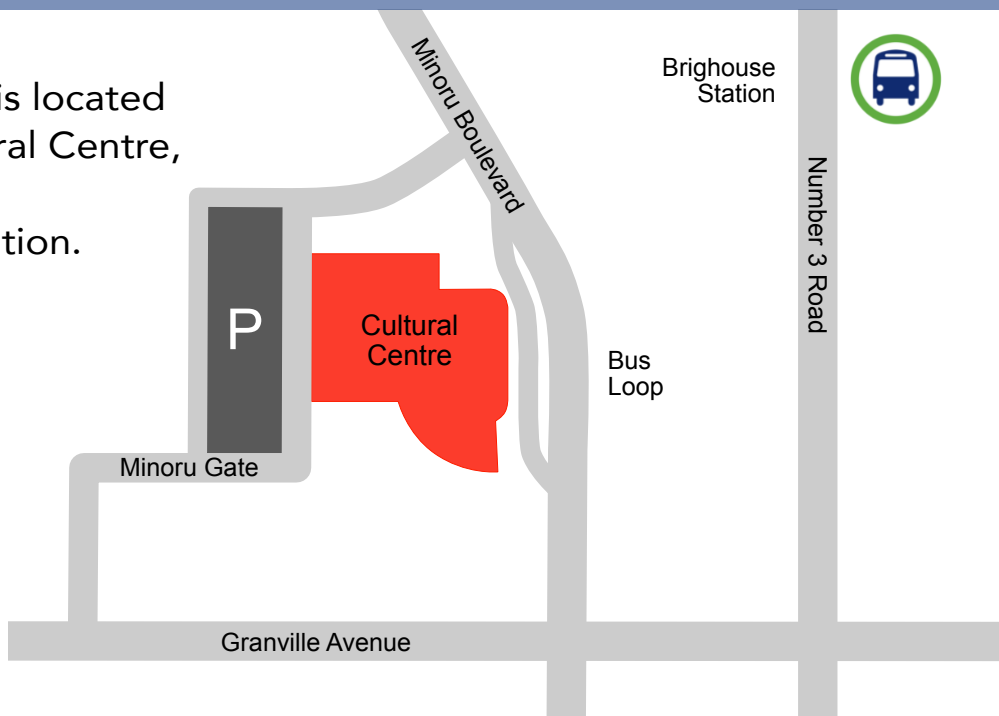
The Richmond Art Gallery is located inside the Richmond Cultural Centre, a ten minute walk from the Brighthouse Canada Line Station.
